The aim of the conference is twofold. First, it discusses and evaluates the reception of Byzantine theology and philosophy by Russian religious thinkers in the 19th and 20th century. The conference investigates the way Byzantine thought was modified and developed by Russian Philosophy, and what role Western philosophy played in this process. It also addresses the question of how far the contribution of Russian thinkers can be regarded as a philosophically and theologically convincing continuation and development of the Byzantine tradition. One of the main tasks in this respect will be to establish the precise relationship between the sophiological tradition and the Byzantine essence-energy distinction.

Second, the conference will examine the relevance of Russian Religious Philosophy to the contemporary world. Characteristic features of this tradition are: all-unity (*vseedinstvo*), epistemological realism, catholicity (*sobornost'*) and integral knowledge (*tsel'noe znanie*). These ideas are employed to envisage the transformation of the world towards its ultimate end and constitute a challenge to both modern and post-modern thought. Russian Religious Philosophy is of universal scope. It not only joins theology with philosophy, but also emphasizes the porosity between theology and all other academic disciplines such as cosmology, metaphysics, aesthetics, linguistics, anthropology, ethics, and the sciences. The conference will explore how far these vast but largely untapped intellectual resources can help us construct a genuinely Christian vision of God, of the world and of the self in the 21st century.
